About Us

Hamden Symphony is excited to return to the Town Center Park Stage for its 2nd appearance at the Hamden Volunteer Firefighter's Fireworks. An all-volunteer orchestra of more than 60 musicians from the Greater New Haven area and beyond, Hamden Symphony members share a passion for rehearsing and performing great music together.

Founded in 1962 by Ruth T. Brooks, the Orchestra provides cultural enrichment to the community of Hamden, Connecticut through its series of concerts, its annual Young Musicians Concerto Competition (YMCC), the Ruth T. Brooks Scholarship Award, and the rewarding experience offered to its members and guest-artists.

The Orchestra's commitment to the musical development of local students is a source of great pride. For the last 49 years the Hamden Symphony Orchestra's YMCC has provided an invaluable educational experience to gifted high school musicians in the area; the chance to perform as a soloist with a full symphony orchestra. The competition is held annually each winter, and the winners are featured at the Orchestra's spring concert. In addition, for over 35 years the Orchestra has honored a graduating Hamden High School senior, who has demonstrated excellence in their musical studies, with the Ruth T. Brooks Scholarship Award. The 2018 winner of this award was Ryan Murphy (Piano, Guitar and Voice), who is one of this evening's featured vocalists.

From 1969-2007, Hamden Symphony Orchestra was under the baton of Maestro Paul Gacek. To honor his distinguished leadership, continuing support and several return appearances to the podium in recent years, Maestro Gacek was officially designated Hamden Symphony Orchestra's "Conductor Laureate" in 2017.

In 2008, Vesna Mehinovic became the Music Director of Hamden Symphony Orchestra. Under Vesna's baton, the Orchestra has continued to expand, and has presented compelling and innovative concert-programs, that have featured new compositions, talented instrumental and vocal soloists, and even dance and multimedia components.

About the Performers

Anjanine Bonet is originally from California, and has been a New Haven resident for the past 12 years. She can be found singing joyfully with Another Octave: Connecticut Women's Chorus, playing violin in bands with friends, or teaching violin. She is excited to be a part of this celebration.

Genesis Brito is a rising senior at Sacred Heart Academy in Hamden. She is very immersed in her school's extra-curriculars as this upcoming school year's president of Show Choir and vice president of the Drama Club, as well as a member of the Honors Chamber Choir. Her previous experiences in theatre and musical theatre include multiple shows in middle school, *The Little Mermaid* (sophomore year), *Chitty Chitty Bang Bang* (junior year), and *Stories I Ain't Told Nobody Yet* (junior year). This Fall she will take on a lead role as Shelly in this year's Sacred Hear Academy musical, *Leader of the Pack*.

Claudia (Quinn) Hauge, Soprano, is honored to be performing with the Hamden Symphony Orchestra for the first time. She is a Sophomore at ECA (Educational Center for the Arts) in New Haven and is an aspiring singer/songwriter, composing songs on guitar and piano. Quinn lives and breathes music, and has written more songs than she can count, which she performs regularly at Quattro's in Guilford.

Karen Anne Kriner, raised in a family of musicians in Norfolk, Virginia, began playing viola at the age of 10 and has played all her life in various ensembles and orchestras. In the late 1980's she attended VCU for classical viola performance and began studying voice. In the early 1990's, she began her singing career as lead female vocalist in top-40 cover bands, traveling the south-eastern states. After taking a break from the music scene in VA, she was excited for the change of scenery and location. In summer 2013, she moved to Hamden, CT with her fiancé Nicholas Souris. In the fall of 2013, Karen joined the soprano section of "Another Octave: Connecticut Women's Chorus" and the viola section of the "Hamden Symphony Orchestra". She serves on both boards of directors and is also the publicity coordinator for AOCWC. Karen is also very passionate about chiropractic and works as an insurance & billing manager in Wallingford. She loves singing and playing viola and feels very lucky to have found venues to pursue her true passions here in Hamden, CT.

Ryan Peter Murphy is a 2018 graduate of Hamden High School and Educational Center for the Arts (ECA) in New Haven. Ryan has performed at Carnegie Hall, NFL's Walter Camp Football Foundation, and the National Cathedral. He has been featured in the world premiere musical "We Have Always Lived in the Castle" at Yale

Repertory Theater, and the world premiere musical "Her Song", written by Jill Nesi and Nick Fradiani Sr, which performed in prestigious venues across CT including the Ivoryton Playhouse, State Capitol and many more. He was a finalist for the Berklee High School Jazz Festival Solo Competition at the Hynes Convention Center in Boston, and recently became a finalist for Michael Feinstein's SongBook Academy in Indiana. He also has sung the National Anthem for the March of Dimes, New Haven Open Final at Yale, and appeared in a Hasbro TV Nerf Commercial.

Louis Napolitano is a recent graduate of Quinnipiac University's Film program. He was heavily involved in the theater and arts program at Quinnipiac. He plans on pursuing a Master's degree at Quinnipiac in Interactive Media and Design. He is currently employed as a Territory Manager for Incrediflix.

Vesna Mehinovic has been the Music Director and Conductor of Hamden Symphony Orchestra since 2008. She began her formal education in music by receiving a diploma in Music Theory and Piano Teaching and Performing from the High School for Music in Sarajevo. She continued her Bachelor of Arts degree in Conducting and Music Theory at the Sarajevo Music Academy, and a Master of Arts in Conducting and Music Theory at Wesleyan University in Middletown.

Vesna has been the recipient of many honors in her native country, and is the first professional woman to conduct an orchestra in Bosnia and Herzegovina. She specialized in Conducting at the Academy for Music and Stage Arts in Graz, Austria in the class of Milan Horvat. Ms. Mehinovic has also served as guest conductor for orchestras in Austria, Serbia, and Croatia.

While in the United States, she has worked with several church and non-religious choirs both in Connecticut and Arizona. As a music teacher Vesna has taught in many elementary, middle, and high schools, as well as having worked with college students at Yale and Wesleyan Universities. Currently, she teaches music and directs the Orchestra and Choirs at Sacred Heart Academy in Hamden. She is also the Conductor of the Quinnipiac University Orchestra, and Organist & Choir Master at St. Michael's Church in Naugatuck.
